# A fantastic Summer for One Heart Bulgaria

This was an exciting Summer for one Heart Bulgaria! Many babas and other employees were honored at a banquet in Plovdiv on May 31. Dr. Nickolai Gavazov, the field director, spoke about the great impact their work has on the children in their care, and several employees received awards from One Heart.

Many thanks to Dr. John Brailsford, whose filmed training session was presented, and Ivan Djambov, former board president, for the fantastic translation of John's training video.

As I prepared my thoughts for the short message I had been asked to give to the assembled One Heart workers, one idea kept coming back into my mind—the role of dreams in our lives. We all have hopes, ideas, and dreams about what our lives will be like. My dream, as a child, was to be a supreme court justice ... and have 12 children! Needless to say, not all of our dreams actually happen. But think, for a moment, about one of your cherished dreams. Wouldn't it be wonderful if your dream came true?







Now consider what the dreams of one of our dear orphaned or abandoned children in Bulgaria might be. The dream of an orphan could be to have a mother, a father, or even just a friend. Maybe there is a child who dreams of something to eat, a warm place to sleep, and a gentle hug instead of hunger, silence, and fear. Our older orphans may dream of the chance to go to college or to get training for a job; there may be a little boy who dreams of his own soccer ball, a little girl who dreams of her own bicycle. Every child dreams of being wanted—finding someone who will listen and love.

Our wonderful babas and teachers are in the dream business. They have put their own wishes on hold, maybe, as they are busy fulfilling the dreams of these young people—they provide the arms that comfort, the gentle encouragement, the celebration that might otherwise be absent from the lives of our Bulgarian children.

It is a wonderful thing to be a dreamer. But in many ways, it is even more wonderful to be the one who makes those dreams come true. And that is the work of One Heart, of our babas, teachers, and all of

During a trip for Dr. Baird's work, they had the opportunity to visit the home they have been sponsoring—and do some service! Mrs. Baird is an experienced artist, so she designed some fun murals to decorate the walls in the entry hall, the playroom, and one of the bedrooms in the

building. When they finished up, they had a party with the children. The sidewalk chalk was a big hit!

The Bairds also came to Kotel Hospital and painted several rooms, including the new "Family Room." The room is designed to be an area where parents and caregivers can take the children to play while they are in the hospital.





# Brightening it up - Kotel Rehabilitation Center

One Heart Bulgaria has been working with the Rehabilitation Center in Kotel for almost ten years, helping with various projects and programs. When they requested artists, though, that was something One Heart hadn't really had experience with. Luckily, the summer of 2016 was a summer of miracles! Heidi's sister-in-law. Michele, and her family were planning on a trip that summer maybe they could come paint, too? It was no surprise that Michele, an artist, had many wonderful ideas for murals as well.

We were asked to paint a large hallway that ran the entire length of the hospital ward; the playroom referred to on the previous page, and several bedrooms. Michele decided to work some of the motifs in the existing trim into the larger mural. She also designed the friendship tree, in the entry hall.

Michele brought several "sensory toys" which had been made by a young woman in her community. They were handed out by Maria, the head nurse. The therapists appreciated the toys, which have various textures, buttons, loops, and colors to encourage learning and play.

Our partnership with Kotel is so rewarding. Recently we made a

\$10,000 donation from DoTerra Healing Hands. These funds will be used to continue renovation work, install air conditioning units, purchase therapy equipment, and other exciting projects.

Alison Garner painted two jungle scene rooms in honor of her son, Noah, who has Down syndrome. Kotel often helps children who have physical or mental disabilities, including Down syndrome; Alison is grateful for the willingness of the hospital to provide excellent care to all children.

## Successful sewing program for teens in Gabrovo

Another program that is providing mcuh needed work and social skills to our children is the sewing program in Gabrovo. For many years now, our wonderful sewing teacher, Rumiana Taneva, has led an outstanding program where the children learn sewing skills, make projects that benefit other orphans, and end up with a certificate. Nickolai reports: "The sewing class in Gabrovo has started the new year with lots of enthusiasm and optomism.... Everybody believes that our project is important and meaningful for the city. We might be covered in the local media too. We owe all of this to our teacher, Rumiana."

Rumiana arranged for the donation of several professional sewing machines, and the class is working with a local firm which will give professional licenses to the children after they complete their training.

Programs like these show how important skills training classes are for these kids. Thank you to everyone who supports this program!
